Non-Tuition Allowable Grants for Students

Federal Pell Grant

Can be used towards living expenses after other state/federal aid has been applied to tuition

Specifications: Open to residents in all US states. Needs-based, awarded to undergraduate students who have not earned a bachelor's degree. However, some postbaccalaureate teacher certification and prison education program students may be eligible.

Deadlines: Each state and/or college may have its own deadline.

Award: As of 2026, the maximum award amount is \$7,395.00. Funds may be paid directly to the student, or their school.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)

Specifications: Open to residents in all US states. Need-based, awarded to undergraduate students who have not earned a bachelor's or professional degree.

Deadline: Not specified, but awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Award: \$100-\$4,000/year

Jannette Rankin Foundation – National Scholar Grant

Specifications: This is an unrestricted non-tuition grant for self-identifying women and non-binary students, 35 years+, who are pursuing a vocational/technical, first associates, or first bachelor's degree at an accredited U.S. institution. Proof of financial need is required.

Deadline: February 13, 2026

Award: Up to \$2,500.00

Jannette Rankin Foundation – Tribal Scholar Grant

Specifications: This is an unrestricted non-tuition grant for self-identifying women, non-binary and Two-Spirit students, 25 years+, who are pursuing a vocational/technical, first associates, or first bachelor's degree at Tribal College. Proof of Tribal affiliation, enrollment in a Tribal College and Pell/SNAP eligibility are required.

Deadline: February 13, 2026

Award: Up to \$2,500.00

Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG)

Can be used towards living expenses after other state/federal aid has been applied to tuition

Specifications/open to:

- Oregon residents (for at least 12 months prior to college attendance) and a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen;
- For dependent students, your parent(s) must live in Oregon
- Out-of-state students who are members of [Native American tribes](#) with traditional ties to Oregon may be considered Oregon residents.
- Undergraduate student with no prior baccalaureate degrees.
- Have financial need based on the difference between cost of attendance and student's financial resources including federal aid and student's estimated family contribution.
- Have no federal student loans in default and not owe refunds on federal student grants.

Deadline: Opens October 2025 for the 2026-27 year

Award: Varies

To apply: Submit a [FAFSA or ORSAA](#) as soon as possible after the application opens each year. No other application is required.

Oregon Tribal Student Grant (OTSG)

Can be used towards living expenses after other state/federal aid has been applied to tuition

Specifications: Open to members of the Burns Paiute Tribe, Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians, Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Coquille Indian Tribe, Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians & the Klamath Tribe. This grant provides funding for eligible Oregon tribal students to offset the cost of attendance at eligible Oregon colleges & universities.

Deadline: Closed September 29, 2025; Check back for the 2026-27 application

Award: Award amounts will vary depending on where you attend school and the degree that you are pursuing. Awards will be reduced by state and federal grants. Awards will also be reduced by publicly funded state and federal scholarships.

Native America Resident Grant (Portland State University -Oregon)

The Native American Resident Grant (NARG) is awarded to qualifying undergraduate first-time resident applicants who are enrolled citizens of a Federally Recognized Tribe for up to 4 academic years. Award amount is \$770 a quarter/\$2100 annually.

Washington College Grant (WCG)

Specifications: Open to WA State residents. provides need-based financial aid to income-eligible resident students pursuing education beyond high school. Award amounts vary based on income, family size, and the school or program attended

Deadline: For FAFSA applications, please see the info above. For WASFA applications January 15th annually.

Washington College Bound Grant (Part of the WCG)

Specifications: Open to WA State residents. Through the generous Washington College Grant (WA Grant), eligible College Bound students who fulfill the program requirements get free public college tuition, or an equivalent amount for an approved private college or career school. Students must apply for financial aid and attend a participating college in Washington.
